

For Property Providers and Tenants

- A FREE service to list and find housing.
- Easy-to-use search tools return housing listings that meet individual needs. Search by desired rent; bedroom/bath amount; or near work, school, and public transportation.
- Listings let landlords showcase units with pictures, map links, information about eligibility requirements, amenities, accessibility features and much more.
- Tenants can find specific information on income-restricted, Section 8, handicapped-accessible, and special-needs housing.
- Landlords enjoy 24/7 access to add, manage, and update property listings.
- Housing Specialists in a toll-free call center assist callers with listing and searching for housing.


For Agencies

Help clients find need-specific housing fast with the Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center.

- Comprehensive housing listings are free to search and provide full contact information and details about special-needs amenities.
- Use interactive income calculators and other helpful relocation tools.
- Free trainings and ongoing support are available for agency staff.

For Public Housing Authorities (PHA)

- The Los Angeles County Housing Resource Center can manage, update, and provide vacancy listings to tenants.
- The service helps increase voucher utilization and save significant agency time and resources.
- Easy-to-use rent reasonableness tools are based on the most current and accurate rental housing data in the industry.
- A GIS-integrated search tool reveals PHA jurisdictions where units are located.
- Serving in collaboration with Housing Authority of the County of Los Angeles (HACoLA), Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles (HACLA), and the City of Pasadena, and growing.



First-Time Homebuyers

Integration of County GIS data with internet mapping functions help pinpoint program-eligible areas and subject properties.

Special-Needs Services

Landlords can have units advertised in additional, private searches when they opt to serve particular populations with special-needs, from veterans to students to people with disabilities or HIV/AIDS.

A confidential search tool available for agencies helps caseworkers to quickly link special-needs renters with the landlords and housing they need.

Recovery and Stimulus

Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing (HPRP)

An easy-to-use pre-screening form determines possible eligibility for HPRP funds. This online tool helps people take first steps to gaining assistance and relief.

- When a form is submitted, results indicate if there is potential for HPRP eligibility. Information is provided about assistance locations and materials to bring along.
- If eligibility is not indicated, the tool offers other options for help.

Homeownership and Foreclosure Resources

- Access tools such as county maps of target areas eligible for homebuyer assistance, along with maps displaying units with broker contact information.
- Links lead to FAQs and help guides.
- A listing of foreclosed and real estate owned (REO) properties can be sorted by funding eligibility.
- A quick guide provides valuable information for lenders, REO managers, real estate professionals, and homebuyers.
